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FERNIE FALL FAIR 2018 BLUE RIBBON ENTRY RULES AND DETAILS

General Rules & Etiquette Entry Categories & Classes

1. Entry Fee: **\$1 per entry**. No fee is required to enter the Pie, Cake, Cupcake and Chili subcategories.
2. Exhibit Registration Times: All entries must be dropped off on Sunday, September 16th between 8:00-10:00am. Late entries will not be accepted.
3. Location: The Fall Fair Exhibit and judging takes place at the City Hall grounds located at 501 3rd Avenue.
4. Entry Tags: All entries will be required to fill out a registration form to participate and entry tags for each of their exhibits.
5. Ownership: All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
6. Judging: In all cases, the judge's decision is final. Categories may be set up at the discretion of the judges or a class may be subdivided if there are numerous entries. The Danish system of judging is used in this competition. In this system, coloured ribbons are used to indicate the placing in the competition. Each entry is judged against a standard and is given a rating. Each entry will receive a placement ribbon. One first, second and third placing will be awarded per class.
7. Disclaimer: Neither the Fall Fair Organizing Committee, the City of Fernie, Wildsight, Wildsight Elk Valley nor the Fernie Museum is responsible for any loss; damage or injury of any nature to property while it is on exhibit. The committee shall take reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of all articles.
8. Removal of Entries: Entries may not be removed from the display until after the event is finished at 3:00pm. Any articles remaining unclaimed after 4:00pm on the day of the Fall Fair will become the property of the Fair Committee and Wildsight Elk Valley.
9. Food Safety: Food items must utilize fresh, local ingredients when possible and be prepared, stored and transported in a food safe manner.
10. Approved containers: Pies, cupcakes and cakes must be submitted in Fall Fair approved containers to reduce contamination at event. Containers are FREE and may be collected at the Wildsight Office, located at

891 2nd Avenue, before the Fall Fair. *Please note: All pies must be entered in a no larger than 10" aluminum pan. Cake containers are 10" wide and 4 3/4" high, and fit a cake of maximum 9" width.*

11. Exhibitors: All ages and abilities are welcome to enter. Participants may enter as an adult, youth, child or family.

Note: Decorated cakes will be utilized during the Cake Walk after judging and will not be returned. Cakes must fit into a Fall Fair approved container. Undecorated cakes will be tasted at time of judging as well as in People's Choice category and will not be returned. Undecorated means no adornments or frostings at all as cake will be judged on appearance and crumb as well as flavour. A clear or translucent glaze is acceptable.
