Here's some of our accomplishments in 2019:

- Our educational partnership with the Meadow Creek Association around McGinty Lake is a resounding success.
- Our T-shirts sold very well as part of our swag sales. We also have a repurposed a hand-made soap we sell for donations.
- We undertook a volunteer survey and will continue to pursue the suggestions made and get to know our volunteers better through their help with our programs and events.
- We made a decision to cancel "Wild and Scenic Film Fest" and hold a local film event instead. However, over the summer, McKim School renovated it's lobby and turned it into a library, which prohibited us from using that venue for that film event and we were forced to cancel it.
- Woody Maguire is our Regional representative on Wildsight and Bryan Duffet is the Wildsight Regional branch liaison person. Bryan is a tremendous help to the branches in helping us address issues with Regional. We are revisiting the Wildsight on-line donations page to make it easier for people to support their local branch.

- January 3 & 4 was our major fund raiser Best of Banff at Key City Theatre. It was a sell out event. This is another event that simply would not be possible without the dedicated volunteers that consistently make this a huge success.
- One of our board members, Nadine Rake, sat on the RDEK's Solid Waste Management Plan Advisory Committee, which resulted in a Solid Waste strategic plan for the RDEK. Nadine had a baby boy, Kai, on December 16th.
- Our branch is also a member of the East Kootenay Humanity Network. Last year
 we celebrated U.N. International Day of Water, U.N. International Day of Forests,

- Our Apple Capture program went very well and there were lots of participants for our Harvest party and apple pressing event in Kimberley on Oct. 22nd.
- The Personnel Committee has developed a wage scale for staff and contractors.

Non-profits are finding it more difficult to obtain funding for core programming and activities. We are most grateful to have wonderful volunteers, who have given so generously of their time and energy, to put on successful events that help fund us.
