Bud Buddies



Spring is a time of many changes. Keep your eyes open to discover a very special tree transformation!

- © Compostable string (twine, wool yarn or cotton string). Nature journal. Camera (optional)
- Grades: 4-7 \(\text{\$\subset\$} \) 10-20 minutes for activity, then 5 minutes every other day

Directions

- Find a bud to become buddies with.
- Tie a string around the branch near the bud. If you are not able to reach a bud or are watching one from your window, don't worry. You know which bud is your special one!
- Get out your nature journal. Write down any questions you have about your bud (start with 'I wonder...').
- Make a record. In your journal make a chart to record your observations. Your chart could look something like this:

- 5. Return to your bud to see how it has changed. Check it everyday or every other day.
- 6. Research any questions you may have about your bud.
